Current Status	We currently use Charanga which is provided by the Lancashire Music Service from EYFS to Year 6. Two years ago I used the Charanga programme builder to re-write a new Music curriculum incorporating the Model Music Curriculum. This is a two year rolling programme due to the split year groups but ensures progression from EYFS to Year 6 and now ensures that the children are exposed to all areas of the Music curriculum including composition and notation which was lacking in the last curriculum. Brass is also currently taught by a specialist teacher to all Year
Future Developments	Observe lessons to ensure consistency in the Music teaching across school.
Timescale and Responsibility	Autumn and Spring term
Resources Necessary	Release from class when Music is being taught

2. Curriculum – Music that is taught as a timetabled slot in the classroom on a regular basis.

Things to consider:

- Frequency - e.g. weekly for 1 hr, fortnightly for 45 mins etc)
- Schemes of Work - Self written, Charanga, Kapow, Sing Up, Music Express etc)
- Staffing – Class teachers, music lead, outside specialists
- Think about your EYFS, KS1, KS2 and SEND curriculums for Primary
- Think about KS3, KS4 and KS5 (if applicable) in Secondary
- Consider your use of Music Technology in the classroom

Current Status	Music is taught once a week by class teachers for approximately 45 minutes. We use Charanga from EYFS to Year 6 but have built our own Lever House Scheme using the Charanga programme builder and the Model Music Curriculum. Catherine Robson is the Music lead in school and has been for the last several years. A Music specialist teacher comes into school once a week to teach Brass sessions. All KS2 classes have access to garage band on their individual iPads.
Future Developments	Develop the use of garage band to help children to compose their own music. Training with Music Advisor using composing on garage band. Developing using Spotify podcasting.
Timescale and Responsibility	2024-2025

3. Whole Class Instrumental Teaching – (only applicable to Primary schools) sessions where the whole class is learning an instrument together. This could be provided in-house or by an external provider (e.g. local music service). These sessions are intended to be IN ADDITION to curriculum music time.

It should also be noted that there is an underlying intention for there to be a progression route available for those pupils who wish to continue learning an instrument after their WCIT sessions have finished.

Current Status	All Year 4 pupils learn to play a Brass instrument. This tuition is provided by a music specialist teacher. The sessions are once a week for a full afternoon. The children then get to take their Brass instruments home so that they can practise. If the children want to pursue Brass tuition further they can do but in their own time.
Future Developments	<p>Sessions with other musical instruments by specialist teachers offered as an After School club.</p> <p>Opportunities in school for the children who have excelled in Year 4 at Brass to pursue it further within school.</p> <p>Signpost children to Lancashire schools Brass band and Lancashire Wind, Brass and percussion Inspire which takes place at weekends.</p> <p>Implementation of Warwick Brass progression pathway with Pbuzz (Year 3) as a precursor to Brass in Year 4.</p>
Timescale and Responsibility	2024-2025

Current Status	At the moment there are no individual or small group instrumental teaching of musical instruments.
Future Developments	Investigate the possibility of PDP teaching with LMS.

Current Status	I attend some Charanga and Lancashire Music hub training at least once a year. Any new developments I can share with staff during the weekly staff meetings.
Future Developments	Open up Music training (Training Thursdays) to any staff who feel that they would benefit from it.

6. Co-curricular/Extra-curricular music – activities that are in addition to but compliment your classroom offer (besides instrumental lessons). Current Status	We have a KS2 choir that I lead which has up to 30 children involved. The choir have learned the songs and then performed at Chorley Big Sing and then Lancashire Sings @ Chorley for the last two years. We have just signed up to do this again this academic year. We also performed a special assembly for parents of the choir who missed Lancashire Sings @ Chorley. The children in EYFS and KS1 perform a Nativity every year. The children in LKS2 perform a Carol service and in UKS2 they perform a play at the end of the academic year.
Future Developments	Brass assembly for parents. Brass band after school.
Timescale and Responsibility	Choir starts in January with weekly after school sessions and ends after Lancashire Sings @ Chorley in June.
Resources Necessary	We pay approximately £100 to take part in Lancashire Sings @ Chorley

Current Status	We don't subsidise or fund PP individual music lessons.
Future Developments	There are no current requests for this at the moment but this is something that we may look into in the future. Look into the possibility of specific PP provision, for example: small Brass group for targeted children.
