

There are many human features in our school grounds such as: buildings, pond, playground, trim trail etc.


There are physical features such as: trees and a field in our school grounds.

The main points of a compass are North, South, East and West.

Aerial photographs are taken from the air.

Maps use symbols instead of words to label key features. A key tells you what each symbol means.

A simple map of the school grounds will show many human features and some physical features. These will be represented by symbols.



Key Vocabulary:

Aerial - something that is in or from the air

Compass - a device used to find direction

Human Feature - features created by humans

Key - a guide explaining the symbols on a map

Physical Feature - natural features not created by humans

Symbol - a drawn representation on a map
